that will be dealt with under the resolution. And so I just struck those words in order to make it consistent. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Open for discussion. Senator Bromm, on the Beutler amendment.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. I thank Senator Beutler for noticing this. It was not intentional to give the impression that we would only apply the restriction of not favoring an incumbent in a legislative or congressional situation. This clarifies that so that that applies to any district we're dealing with, whether it be Board of Regent or Public Service Commission or whatever. So I think the amendment is a good clarification, I support it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Further discussion on the amendment FA407? Senator Beutler, seeing none, do you wish to close? Senator Beutler waives closing. The question before the body is, shall FA407 be adopted to LR 494? All in favor of the question vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the Beutler amendment. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Beutler amendment, FA407, is adopted. We're now open for discussion on LR 494. Senator Coordsen.

As we all know, this resolution is not binding but rather provides a sense of direction for the Legislature during the interim.
