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still support that. But I like to look...as I looked over all the list of vetoes the Governor made, this is the first one I marked that I would support an override on, and I think it's really important for all of Nebraska. I'd just like to make a couple comments. Years ago there used to be people on every corner out there across this state and the people supported schools. There's not that...not hardly anybody out there anymore in them places where they used to be. Around my area, vacant houses are all over the place. And the real estate is supporting it now and I think it's got to get back so people will support it again and the only way you can do that is it's going to have to go on sales and income tax so people will support it, and I think this is a step in the right direction. So as I look over these, I think this is the most important one we can do today and that's the only one I've actually got marked "yes" on. I got some questions on a couple others. But, anyway, I think Senator Wickersham is doing the right thing here. And he mentioned heel flies. I've seen a lot of the heel flies in my area too and I drew a couple pictures on his graph here that showed a cow on each one of them, the tail sticking right up in the air on each one of them humps. So that will give you an idea just how it's going up and how we could correct it by going down. So, with that, I'd just continue to support this. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jones. Senator Wehrbein, followed by Senators Tyson and Beutler.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I've had a difficult time on this because I've supported LB 1107, I...although I especially went from 45 to 47 percent. But I will tell you at this point I'm not going to vote to override the veto, primarily because of the lack of flexibility that I see. And I will talk more about this later, much to your chagrin I'm sure. But if you look at the bottom side of the handout that I have where the top says the potential items not in the current financial status, the top talks about the veto override potentials and the...and the middle is the potential of funds, and I'll talk more about that later, and the bottom is the potential items that we may have in the future. The point is we're going to have to be deciding where our...where our real allegiance is going to lie as we face future budgets, and that's
