SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, if you include special ed it in the neighborhood of \$750 million. I could look it up a little closer to that.

SENATOR TYSON: Okay, \$750 million now,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Be \$730 to \$750.

SENATOR TYSON: ...three-quarters of a billion dollars. Is that right?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Pardon?

SENATOR TYSON: It's three-quarters of a billion dollars.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR TYSON: Okay. Now I'd just like to ask you one more figure and I know you'll have this on the tip of your tongue. Precisely how much is it going to cost us in additional state aid for education next year if LB 1107 is passed into law over the Governor's veto?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I got to think about that. If it...

SENATOR TYSON: It's not there. I looked.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I have it. No, I don't either. I'll get that to you. I don't have...

SENATOR TYSON: Okay. The point that I'm making is that "Squire" Wehrbein doesn't know the number, no one else does either, I believe. Have you...do you have an approximation?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: You said, if LB 1107 does not?

SENATOR TYSON: If LB 1107 is passed over the Governor's veto, how much additional state aid will it cost us? In other words, how much more do we have to put into state aid to balance that out against the local effort rate?
