large costs every year. And then the rest of it is question marks and you'll have to fill in your own numbers down there, but those are potentially enormous numbers. The low-level radioactive waste lawsuit, the Wireless Communications Act, teacher salaries, if many of you in here have some...have something in mind for next year, and I'm sure many of us do, especially those that are on the task force, what is it going to do to our budget...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...next year for teacher salaries? And A bills which we have not allowed for but this year our A bills have run...I'm going to estimate \$15 to \$20 million, conservatively. Anyway, the bottom line there is \$167 million more. Now, adding in anything that we do this year makes next year's job that much more difficult, and that's the point I want to make. So, in spite of many of the good things that are coming and perhaps ought to be done in one way or another, we also have an opportunity to look at those more carefully another year. I believe in this particular area I'm not going to dispute much of what Senator Thompson said, but I am very hopeful and optimistic that we can maybe do that more effectively, maybe efficiently isn't the right word, but at least be more cost-effective and get into some of the things that were being proposed that we honestly did not get to this year.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Dwite Pedersen, on the motion.
