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an evening or whatever, there is no limit to that. And we as a state, I don't think, can afford to do that over and over again. I really commend Senator Thompson. I'm on...she's on Health and Human Services Committee, I'm on that committee also. She has worked diligently on this area. The two of us toured the Youth Correction Center in Omaha. And, you know, it's my desire to bring the committee, all of the committee members up there this summer on a tour, to look at that facility and to see firsthand the problems. I want also the committee to meet again with the Douglas County Commissioners. We did that last year, and it wasn't fun because they really raked us over the coals, and we'll get that same thing again. And so I'm prepared for that. But we do look at the numbers and we look at where we're going. And we've just got to make some very heavy decisions. And you look at the out years, we do have a year to plan. I really feel, just like Senator Bromm, that I hope that we can correct this situation, that we can come to terms with this, that we can put things in priority as to where they should be, that we can take care of this situation and give the counties some relief.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: They certainly need it. They're not...the state can better, with a percentage of Medicaid, take care of this than what the counties are, I absolutely believe that. But right now at this time I cannot support the veto override, and that pains me. It pains me because I think it is deserving. But you look at the future years, you look at where we're going, you look at the dollars we've got, you look at the percentage of increase that we're going to have this year, a short...you know, an off year on the budget, and we just cannot afford that. I passed out a sheet from the Bloomberg Personal Finance. That does not correspond what...with the...Nebraska people say here. I only pass it out for your information but, however, that does kind of correspond to what Money magazine also states, is that we are...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...very...thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Beutler. Question has been called.
