leaves no meaningful opportunity to address the needs of children and families and does not meet national standards of judicial justice, which recommend at least 30 to 60 minutes for all disposition and review hearings. Well, they're supposed to be hearing one to two and they're hearing four to five in an hour. In addition to an ever-increasing caseload, the behavioral and emotional difficulties exhibited by today's juvenile court population are growing quite serious, making it more difficult and more consuming of time to meet the needs of children, families and communities. Also, due to the recent changes in federal and state law more urgency is given for the need to terminate parental rights. In many cases, motions to terminate parental rights are very time consuming and require a more thoughtful and prudent approach. Do we want to sever these kids from their parents just at the drop of a hat? I...our judicial...or our Legislative Fiscal Office has said that this is going to take three hundred and some thousand dollars. I don't think it will...will do that much. When Senator Wehrbein last night found the magic \$2.8 million, I was curious as to the number and kinds of funds that we have that we didn't know about. This is our funds book, people. See how many funds we have. There's a fund on every page of this, all kinds of funds used for this and that and the other. I think we ought to look at where the funds are coming from and, yes, we went through the requirements just as Senator Cudaback went through the requirements that...from the commission that we set up. We didn't want to make the decision...we didn't want it to be political. Now we have the recommendations from the commission and we still don't want to make the decisions. We still don't want to do it. I would submit that the 43 of you who voted for this a couple of days ago should think carefully about the kids in Douglas County at least, if not the poor judges in Douglas County, and think about the poor judges in Senator Cudaback's district that are working so hard to try to do the work that they are supposed to be doing and don't have time to do it. They spend a lot of time in their car out there. If anybody's been out there lately, it takes a long time to get from one place to another. They spend a lot of wasted time driving around from place to place. I would urge you to override this veto. It is not that expensive. We're not talking about millions and millions and millions. We're talking about a couple of hundred thousand dollars here. And with all our
