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likely to die in emergency rooms in this state of heart attacks as opposed to men, because there is not information, there is no education about women's health care needs. The number two killer of women in this state is cancer, but it's not breast cancer as we have heard a lot about, it is lung cancer. There needs to be information and education in this state with regard to the fact that that's the number one cancer killer of women. And probably what goes along with that, too, is the fact that if women smoke they're going to be much more likely to die of lung cancer. This is part of what we need to do in this state in a comprehensive approach to information and education and dissemination of that information in education to women in this state. That's what this health initiative is intended to do. It is about women. And, you know, we tend not to pay a whole lot of attention to strictly women's issues in this body, and we tend not to pay a whole lot of attention to women's issues in the state of Nebraska. I think this is a very, very small step toward rectifying that situation. It's not a big step, for heavens sakes, it's not very much money at all. I think we have spent a lot of money on a lot of different legislation, a lot of different pieces of legislation this year that call for a lot more money. I think this is probably much more important as far as the impact on the citizens of the state of Nebraska than a lot of the other bills that we passed this year. And my seatmates know that I have made a habit recently of saying, if we'd only designate whatever the population happens to be and whatever the bill happens to be, as beginning farmers, we probably get the money for it. But since we're not going to do that, I would ask this body to consider the women and consider the girl children in their districts and vote to override this veto, because I think this is very, very important for them. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Matzke.

SENATOR MATZKE: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature. I've supported this bill all along and I continue to support it on the override. I want to say for the record that I was with Senator Schimek and Senator Crosby when we met with the Governor in his office, about a month ago, on this bill.
