work, we don't even have to put in the enabling legislation in two years. It would just completely take care of itself. If it proves to be needed then, of course, it's a voluntary pilot program. Sunsets in four years if it doesn't work, if there's not enough interest in it. My office has received a lot of letters, phone calls and e-mails being interested in starting already at this point in time. With that, I just ask the body to override this veto. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the closing. The question before the body is, shall LB 1092 pass notwithstanding the objections of the Governor? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Senator Robak.

SENATOR ROBAK: Could I have a call of the house, please?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: There's been a request to place the house under call. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay.

SENATOR ROBAK: And a roll call vote, please.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Please record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The house is under call. Would all unexcused members please report to the Chamber and record their presence. The house is under call. Senator Engel, would you please check in. Was there a request for a roll call vote, Senator Robak? You requested, yes? And then was there a request for an order, Senator Robak? In regular order. Thank you. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal pages 1737-1738.) 25 ayes, 10 nays on the override motion, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The bill does not pass. I raise the call.

CLERK: Senator Robak, LB 1092A, I assume you want to withdraw at this time, Senator?
