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change. That's the only change. Senator Bruning gave the example of going to Arizona and having to report that expenditure as if it's a new thing. It's not a new thing. He would have had to report that expenditure anyway, or that gift anyway, if it were over \$100, because that was current law. The only thing Senator Bruning is going to have to do differently is to make a good faith estimate of about how much it was and put it in the appropriate three or four categories. Four categories? Three categories? The only things that change here are a little bit of...little bits of refinement as far as disclosure is concerned. And with regard to these kinds of laws generally, I think we've generally been in agreement in this body that disclosure is good, disclosure is appropriate. That's fair to the public. That's fair to us. So I don't see any reason not to vote for this bill.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Schimek on the motion to bracket LB 1021.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Chris, you just gave my speech for me. I mean, that was exactly what I was getting up to say. This isn't that different. It isn't that new. And in fact, Senator Bruning should already be reporting those kinds of gifts. I guess what I think this discussion and this bill has done, more than anything else, is to raise the awareness level about what is currently law and what we all need to currently be doing. So if we never pass this bill...and I certainly don't wish that, I hope that we do pass this bill...if we'd never pass the bill, a lot of good would have come from the discussion. And I agree with Senator Beutler. Why are we being so super sensitive about this? This is not unreasonable, and it is not bad to discuss these things every once in a while. It's for our own good as well as the public good. I'm not going to belabor the point, except to encourage Senator Bruning to start making those reports. And with that, I would encourage your continued support of the Chambers bill.
