most of us in here don't have a problem with disclosure. I certainly don't. Every campaign contribution I've received, every dollar I've spent, is open to public scrutiny. And that's fine. That's the way it ought to be. I don't think any of us argue with that. What I do have a problem with is when we get into sort of a witch hunt mentality, where we're looking for something that's not there. And I don't...I think you're going to find, at least in the members of the Legislature, an honest group of people who is hard working. And this particular bill doesn't give that impression. It gives the impression that that's not the case, when in my opinion it is the case. I appreciate that discussion. With that, Mr. President, I would withdraw the bracket motion.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The motion is withdrawn. Madam Clerk, LB 1021.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 1021 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? Those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Have you voted? Madam Clerk, please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal page 1757.) The vote is 42 ayes, 6 nays, 1 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is passed. LB 1025.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 1025 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? Those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Voting on LB 1025. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal pages 1757-1758.) The vote is 46 ayes, 0 nays, 2 present and not voting, 1 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is passed. LB 1025A.
