SENATOR KIEL: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Is there any discussion? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, what I'm going to do is seek a division of the question so that we will take the top two names as one vote and then Ms. Streeks as a second vote.

SENATOR KIEL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. It is divisible. We will take the top two names first, Bauerkemper and Nutt. Senator Janssen, you're recognized.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right, we will take both of those together then, Madam President. Thomas Nutt was also appointed or was heard that day at the General Affairs Committee and he also is being asked to be appointed to the Nebraska Advisory Commission on Compulsive Gambling. Mr. Nutt is from Holdrege, Nebraska, comes with high qualifications also. He has attended the University of Nebraska at Kearney and the FBI National Academy for Law Enforcement and has had the Nebraska State Patrol training as a law officer. The committee confirmed him at the meeting, seemed like a very qualified person to us.

SENATOR KIEL: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Chambers, your light is next.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I'm speaking only to make it clear, as I have in the past, when I vote against these confirmations that this is a protest vote against the way the Governor makes these nominations and, in my opinion, ignores women and minority groups. So this no vote is not intended to reflect on the qualifications of these two gentlemen who shall remain nameless as far as my attempting to pronounce their names. Thank you, Madam President.
