statutorily, have to change the membership on Exec Board. So what we do today will dictate to us what we do statutorily as to membership later on the Exec Board. I'm simply trying to carry out the wishes of those two members. As I said, they signed on in the committee. My proposal last special session, I believe it was the last special session, was similar to what Senator Beutler has proposed here, with the exception of leaving 3 in the 2nd Caucus and 34 in the 1st. So that's what my amendment does. It does move the extra person into the 1st...or the 2nd District Caucus, so there would be 16, 16, and 17 in what I call the Omaha caucus. So that, in a nutshell, is what it does. I think it's important that we do get some uniformity. I know the new members, when we were trying to organize the first day of the session, were confused as to where they belonged on Committee on Committees meetings or Exec Board meetings and so on. It's paramount, the whole question is, to get some uniformity in here and I'm simply trying to do what committee members...or, I'm sorry, senators had requested to do, which, as I said, the time frame was such Friday that I didn't converse with these senators that now are represented in this proposed amendment. So that's the rationale. We simply are trying to facilitate leaving these people where they feel secure, I guess, and where they think they belong, and I would ask your support for the amendment. Thank you.
