SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah. I think that's truthfully kind of the way it happened.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Okay. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Mossey. Senator Preister.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the body, I rise...I'm going to vote against the amendment, but I'm going to vote for the committee proposal. I think the Rules Committee did a good job and I commend them. I think they worked on trying to come up with a system that was fair and to do the one thing that we needed. The one thing we needed was to make for consistency between the 1st Caucus and the 3rd Caucus. There were two people in each of those caucuses, and, Senator Connealy, I think you may have been one of those people, that had to go to two different caucuses--one for the Exec Board selection and one for the Committee on Committees selection--and that really is unfair to those four people. That really needed to be changed. And so the Rules Committee took on that task of making that adjustment. Other than that, there really was nothing else that needed to be changed, and so they did that and they did it in a way, as I look at this, that minimized the impact on everybody else. And so the one thing that needed to be changed, the consistency, is done with the Rules Committee proposal and it also minimized the impact on every individual senator. Only three people, outside of those that are on two caucuses who needed to be changed, are affected, and actually Senator Kremer and Senator Mossey could end up with the same or even better committee assignments as a result of the change. And I would think that, I can't speak for them, but I would think that each of "them's" main interest would be being able to get the committees that they want, and I think under the proposal by the Rules Committee they would have just as good a chance and perhaps even a better chance of doing that with what the Rules Committee has proposed. So, even though there are just two senators who are having an issue, any time we try to reconfigure, redistrict, reorganize and do any of those adjustments and we can come down to only two people having some concern with it, and I don't know that it's total objection, at
