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record to reflect, that if I in any way offended you by using the term "frolic of your own," it's one I use frequently, and I've used it to describe my own activities. And if you were offended by that, I certainly want the record to indicate that I apologize to you. I hope you recall that I talked about...and I want to acknowledge, by the way, that you told me what you were going to do and that you were going to be citing me as some sort of a premise for what you were doing. And so that's why I came the floor, in respect, to debate you. And I also want you to know that the...I...at some point in my discussion I know I also talked about you doing your duty as you saw it, and I hope you'll recall those words. And by the way, Senator Maxwell, I still stand in opposition to your motion to suspend and the Maxwell amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Senator Maxwell, there are no further lights on. You're recognized to close on your motion, if you care to.

SENATOR MAXWELL: Thank you, Mr. President. Let me just review again. I see it working this way. We vote on the motion. If the motion does not carry, I'll withdraw the amendment. That's a signal from the body that there's not support for the amendment, and we'll move on from there. We've covered about everything I could think of, including a couple of things that I hadn't thought of in this debate. Thank you. Senator Brashear, yes, I mostl'y jumped on the word "frolic" to try to make a few points of my own. I appreciate your comments. My approach on all of this is live and let live. Vote your consciences. Vote what you think is right. That's what I'll be doing. I think 60 percent is a reasonable threshold. And I encourage the body to vote for the motion, and then vote for the amendment. Can I get a ruling, Mr. President, on how many votes we need to...for the motion to carry?

SENATOR CUDABACK: It does take 30 votes, Senator Maxwell.

SENATOR MAXWELL: Okay, thank you. In that case, that will conclude my remarks. I'll ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote, please.
