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because it's been going on for quite awhile. And I'm not a troublemaker, I don't think. Am I, Senator Wehrbein? No, no, no, no. (Laughter) I don't generally come to the floor with things like this, but I think it's a pretty important issue and it has to do with the functioning of our committees in this body. And, generally speaking, Special Committees, generally speaking, aren't Standing Committees. They don't have the ability to have a lot of hearings and so forth. I would also like to mention to Senator Beutler that the State Auditor can do performance audits of local subdivisions, and I don't want that to be lost sight of. That is important. I am not advocating that the State Auditor do performance evaluations at the state level. I'm not advocating that at this point. I think there's some real pitfalls in going that direction. On the other hand, I believe that performance audits really need to be done. I would be more than happy to have the committee, the Rules Committee, look at this, if it were going to be a serious look and if it weren't going to just be buried if people thought that there were any...if the people on the Rules Committee thought that there were some justification to looking at this language. I disagree with Senator Chambers. I think it's so broad now that you could drive a truck through it, or a horse or whatever you want to drive. You could...you could do that. And it allows the Reference Committee a great deal of latitude, I think, in assigning bills to committee. Now I've sent...I've sat on the Referencing/Executive Committee before and I believe they do a very good job, by and large. They've got huge numbers of bills that come in every day that they need to reference and, by and large, I think they get it right. Occasionally, you have to go to them and you have to say I think this bill should have gone to that committee, or it should have come to this committee or whatever, and generally speaking that all works out. But when it becomes a pattern, like I think it's done here, I think that it needs to be brought to somebody's attention, and that's the only reason I am here before you today. The address confidentiality thing,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...I believe that it can be worked out and I believe that eventually it will come to the Government Committee
