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member of the Executive Board and I do not think we made the wrong decision referring that bill to ourselves. But the point I'm emphasizing here is that bill would have had a public hearing. There would have been a public notice given, and the hearing would have been conducted as hearings are conducted, in accord with the Rules of the Legislature, and everybody on this floor knows that. So, for the World-Herald, the largest paper in the state, to not get its facts straight means that they are not seeing things as those things are, but they're seeing them as the World-Herald is. The World-Herald, by this editorial, shows that it plays fast and loose with the facts, does not tell the truth, and deliberately misleads the public. Why do I say deliberately? Because they have access to all the facts and a responsibility to get those facts before they impugn the integrity of the Legislature and its process. If the board had said this bill will not get a hearing, I would have opposed that. But had that been the case,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the editorial would have been correct. It is wrong, it is totally inappropriate, and I'm going to deal with these kind of issues that impugn the system inappropriately. Attack our positions, attack our votes, but don't misrepresent the way we conduct our affairs. I could go on forever, but fortunately for you all there's a limit in terms of the amount of time that can be spent, but I think, at least I hope, I've made the point that I got up to make. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Schimek, on committee amendments to LB 67.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. I want to echo, in some respects, what Senator Chambers just said, even though he and I disagree about which committee the bill should have gone to. It was inaccurate and I don't know if...Senator Chambers, if we spent all of our time in here correcting (laugh) all the misinformation that goes out on the airwaves and on the...in the newsprint, we'd be spending a lot of time doing that, but your point is well taken. The Executive
