It's over the noonhour, generally speaking. But I do agree with you on that and I think it's important to let the news media know when there are errors. My only caveat to that is how much time are we going to spend, because it happens more than once. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Bromm.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President, and I rise to briefly address the subject raised by Senator Chambers, which I appreciate that he has raised, and maybe from a little bit different perspective, but certainly the editorial is inaccurate. It paints a negative picture of how we decide what bills go to what committee and to that I take offense. And I don't know if they talked to any member of the Executive Board, I know they didn't talk to me, so certainly the slant that they have did not come from my position. I would be interested in knowing if they talked to any Executive Board member before writing such an editorial and taking that much space to, what I consider, criticize or impugn the integrity of the Legislature. Which leads me to another point, and this is as good a time as any to make it. Since I've been Speaker the last few days, I've sat down and wrote a couple of letters, which I have not sent off, but I felt better after I wrote them. (Laughter) And let me just say this; that for every bit of damage we do to ourselves and to the institution, it takes a great amount of time and effort to repair that damage. So if we're going to do that and take it upon ourselves to not necessarily take...we all should and have every right to take issue with any subject that comes before us, but when we take issue with the character of the Legislature or the motives of why you vote this way or that way, then we are taking the Legislature to a lower level than it deserves to be at. I have every confidence that everyone is here with the best of intentions. Lots of sacrifices are made to be here and you never receive any credit for that, but you certainly don't deserve to have your motives questioned, your votes questioned from an integrity standpoint. Many internal things that we have to do here are just that; they are internal things that we have to make decisions on. Feelings get hurt.
