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through inadvertence, sometimes through bad faith. I'd like to ask Senator Hartnett this question.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yes, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Hartnett, what is the maximum number of members on one of these boards, wherever it's situated, that you're aware of?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Right now, Senator Chambers, by state law, it's five. And I think what we were told in committee...and we've had this, you know, bill for a couple of years...that that's kind of restrictive. So I...you know, I would be amenable to amendment up to seven, or something like that. And that would eliminate...I think that would maybe take care of some of your concerns.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. If you said seven, I would agree with that.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So would you want the amendment to say from no fewer than three and no more than seven?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Are you going to draft that amendment, or...?

SENATOR HARTNETT: I...or we can do...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We could do it on Select File. I'll take your word for it.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Let's do it on Select...yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We'll work that out.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Let's do it on Select File, Senator Chambers. We'll...
