intimidating to have them leaning over into your car and asking you for a contribution to their local organization. And I just don't think that that's an appropriate way to raise money. I know it's an easy way in some respects, but I think that the safety concerns ought to be paramount for us. The second reason I did not vote to advance the bill is because of the very issue that Senator Chambers has raised. I think it's going to be very difficult to say no to any organization, very, very difficult. And if you can't say no to any organization, you could have a mess out there on the highways and byways. And I just...I don't want to go down that road, (laugh) so to speak. And so, Senator Chambers, I'm going to support your amendment, because I think that essentially kills the bill anyway. And I'm going to support it, and then I won't probably vote to advance the bill, just to make sure. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Any further discussion on Fall46? Seeing none, Senator Chambers, did you wish to close?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Only to say, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, that Senator Pedersen, who brought this bill, stated succinctly, to do anything less than what this amendment proposes is immoral. I hope you will adopt the amendment. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the closing on Fall46. The question is, should that be adopted to LB 86? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the adoption of Fall46 to LB 86. Have you all voted who care to? We're voting on the adoption of Fall46, offered by Senator Chambers to LB 86. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The amendment was adopted.
