know, to get in that lane and get past the traffic while you can. And to me, that's sets up a situation I think you're going to see over time, if we pass this law, of somebody soliciting to the last second, realizing they have to get out of the way, take a couple steps back into a lane with fast-moving traffic all of a sudden, and they're going to be hurt. And if they're hit in the wrong place, they're hit in the head, they don't have to be hit by a car going very fast to have some very serious damage. So, notwithstanding what you do with this amendment, I hope we'll think real seriously about this particular bill. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. You've heard the opening on FA1147 to LB 86. Open for discussion on that amendment, Senator Dwite Pedersen, followed by Senator Chambers.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, I see this amendment as only being sensible and being friendly to the bill. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Pedersen. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I support Senator Beutler's amendment also. Not only might children be grouping and trying to do things to raise money, some adults would have those children out there. I heard on the news this morning where some parents dressed up a 7-year-old child in a Cub Scout uniform and raised \$700 for themselves, using the child as the bait. And I don't know whether the excuse was that they had lost a job or something, but whatever it is, children should not be misused in that manner. There are outfits that sell candy and other types of things who will pick children up in poor neighborhoods and persuade the parents that they are going to look out for them, and they will make so much and so much money; they'll be supervised. Then I started getting complaints because these children were in virtual servitude. They were taken outside the city of Omaha, sometimes to small towns. They were not given anything to eat that was nutritional. They might be given a candy bar and a can of pop. They were made to stay out there and sell this candy because
