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SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, they have for the last two years, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, do you believe we ought to put unnecessary legislation on the books?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: In some cases.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, if it's unnecessary, why should we put it on there? If it's unnecessary, that means it's not needed. You think there are some times we ought to put legislation on the books that's not needed?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, not necessarily.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Laughing) Are you looking at your bill?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I'm going to jump around this.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, you're going to get me so I'm not going to let you go down that path. Do you have a copy of your bill before you?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I certainly do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, would you turn to page 2.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, in line 11, ..

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...such policy shall provide a minimum benefit. Isn't every fire district and every city which has one of these outfits able to put a policy in place for any amount they choose?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.
