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minimum should be set in statute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, this policy does not apply only if a firefighter, one of these volunteer persons, dies in the course of duty, does it?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No. I mean if they would...it is a...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: He could be shooting pool with a guy who just got out of the coal mine, and this guy got his pickax with him, and he thinks that the guy spoke on his cue, and he miscued, so the guy who miscued takes his pickax and chops the firefighter in the head with the pickax and kills him. He'd recover under this policy, wouldn't he?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, he would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If the firefighter, God forbid this should happen, should be found in a compromising position with...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...another person's wife, and that other person shot the firefighter, this policy would pay, wouldn't it?

SENATOR JANSSEN: If he's dead, he's dead; that's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If the firefighter were robbing a bank and were shot by an officer of the law, this policy would pay. Is that right?

SENATOR JANSSEN: As long as he's dead.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Laughter) I have to ask another question or two, so I'll put on my light.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may continue, Senator Chambers. Your light is next.
