SENATOR JANSSEN: Not the association, unless they belong, if those particular members of that association belong to a volunteer fire or rescue department in their home or in that district.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And the League of Municipalities would have members who authorize these volunteer fire departments. Is that true?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, they would have members, right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And they supported the bill.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If everybody is in support of it, why do we need to put another law on the books?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I would imagine because there are some departments that don't realize what the cost of a funeral is right now, and it is...does exceed \$5,000, which it was intended to cover primarily in 1971. But now with the inflation as...I mean you can't die as cheap as you used to, Ernie. That's just the way it is. So...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, are you intending to push one particular philosophy with reference to how remains ought to be disposed of?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Am I...I am sorry, I didn't follow you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you pushing, with this bill, one particular method by which human remains are to be disposed of?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, I'm certainly not. I mean you can dispose of...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How much does a cremation cost?
