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SENATOR JENSEN: A hundred and fourteen thousand; how many others are out there I don't know.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR JENSEN: But, certainly, it's my understanding that they are.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, and many of the licenses in current law, as you noted, are subject to specific fees that are set forth statutorily, and this bill is wiping out all of those and setting up a cost-share mechanism that's perceived by most everybody to be a fairer process.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. You indicated that for most all of them it would result in a reduction in what they pay to be licensed. If there are some who would have an increase in the licensing cost, could you identify those for us now so we know who we might be hearing from here?

SENATOR JENSEN: Swimming pool operators, their fee went up some, and I can give you a copy of a list that's got all of those. If I recall, nurses might have gone up a small amount.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: But I think the best thing would be to look through a list. Matter of fact, I could pass on out to everyone as to the adjustment of the fees up and down, but generally they have been down.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. The...you indicated earlier that the cost impact you thought was at least neutral. Is that to indicate that there is no reduction in the expenditure of, even though the General Funds are not heavily relied upon in this area anyway, does the bill represent a dropping in that \$67,000 figure that we currently have for General Funds in that area? Is this bill going to reduce that any?
