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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Beginning in line 20 through lines 23, what are we talking about? It says "support" but when we say "and includes interest as provided by law" in line 23, is this language moved from someplace else and put here, or is this a new item tacked on to the current law where interest is now being charged where before it was not?

SENATOR JENSEN: It's really to make it consistent. Support is defined in three different acts relating to child support,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Um-hum.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...the Income Withholding for Child Support Act, the License Suspending (sic) Act, and sections on the Bank Match System. The definitions in the License Suspension Act and the sections on the Bank...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...Match System are essentially identical.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But I want to know is this new language underlined in page...in line 23 on page 28, "and includes interest as provided by law," I presume "as provided by law" might mean the rate of interest, or is there someplace else where interest in this context exists, charged or tacked onto these items that are listed here?

SENATOR JENSEN: The phrase needs to be added because Federal Regulations 45 CFR 303.100 provide that interest for child support judgments may be collected through income holdings. And so it's just complying with what the federal regulations are.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What you read said "may." From the say I read this language, it's mandatory, is that right, because it says support shall mean? So it means support shall include interest.

SENATOR JENSEN: I believe that's included in the definition, Senator.
