us time to look at the federal regulations, look at other places in the statutes where this same language occurs, and then between now and Select File we can come up with that, and hopefully Senator Chambers and my staff and myself can work through this. And then, if it needs to be...if the section needs to be put back in, I'll introduce an amendment to do that on Select File. So, at this point in time, I will accept the deletion of Section 3. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Chambers, there are no further lights. Do you wish to close on your amendment? He waives closing. Members, the question is the adoption of AM1148 (sic), offered by Senator Chambers. All in favor please vote aye, and opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: The amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Bromm, members of the Legislature, Senator Jensen, just a couple of things that perhaps you could take a look at when you're looking at Senator Chambers' request. One is the provision on page 29 that provides for much shorter notice to businesses with regard to when withholding begins. DHH sent me some information on that last night, but I still would like to discuss that further at some point in time. The other thing that I wanted to mention to you at this moment in time is whether somebody could take a close look at Section 54-311, which was repealed. That is a general provision with respect to the unlawfulness of main...of allowing what they call pitfalls and/or wells to remain in a dangerous condition, and I think you still need at least part of that, and probably most of it, rather than repealing it entirely. I think it has a broader effect repealing it entirely than what is intended. And so please take a look at that part too, if you would. Thank
