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Game and Parks commissioners to get them into office, not enough corporate heads to get them into office. So they get the ordinary people's vote, then do the work of those who have interests contrary to those of the people. And that boggles my mind. So at least those who stick it to the public in this way are going to work for the few hours they have to work on the floor of the Legislature. They are not going to easily load up these burdens on the public in a way that I think are inappropriate.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. Speaker, members, there's one thing about a legislator. I guess he always wants to justify. Or most of us do, anyhow. Some don't have to. But I guess I justify or rationalize or some means of knowing why I push that green button rather than the red button. But in this case, maybe. Now, if we have not raised these for ten years, I don't want these funds coming out that it takes to operate the Game and Parks, I don't want them coming from the so-called General Fund either. So I'm not for sticking it to people who want to hunt. But if it's costing more than it did back ten years ago, then somebody's paying the difference. I guess I don't want to pay that difference from the General Fund. I don't hunt. I don't fish anymore. So is it fair to charge me for what it takes them to carry on their duties? I mean, I'm not...here I am, I guess I'm justifying. But it's ten years. We all know what's happened to inflation. All but the last three years, and I guess we all know what happened there; we all dropped about half of what we had. Of course, half of nothing is still nothing. But anyway, we still have to go back ten years, and what's going to take place. I don't want this coming from the General Fund or from Medicaid or from other issues just to supply the game wardens or whomever, funds to carry on their duties. That should be self-supporting, in my view. I don't know. Maybe I'm wrong. I don't know. But ten years to the date. Is it costing more? I guess that's the question. So I'm going to listen here. So if it's the same price...I think you know what I'm...I better sit down. I think you know what I mean already. So maybe I'm right and maybe I'm wrong. But anyway, let's compare prices here, and go from there. Thank you.
