

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE
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CLERK: I do, Mr. President. Senator Chambers would move to indefinitely postpone the bill. Senator Stuhr, you would have the option to lay the bill over at this time.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: No, I'll take it up.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Stuhr elects to take it up. So now the discussion would be on the motion to indefinitely postpone. Senator Chambers to open.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Wehrbein a question, because I really don't know the answer to it, and I hope he may.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Wehrbein,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SPEAKER BROMM: ...do you yield to a question?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein, when money was being taken from various funds as a temporary stopgap to get us through a crisis situation, was anything taken from Game and Parks?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I do not recall that any was. No. Just a minute, I will verify. Oh, we took the Environmental Trust Fund money. That is a division that's managed or administered under Game and Parks.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But the money that goes into the Environmental Trust does not come from these fees, is that true?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Was there any money taken from any fund which gets that money by way of fees, that you're aware of? Not just in Game and Parks.
