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do that?

SENATOR STUHR: I would not be supportive of that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But we can do that, can't we?

SENATOR STUHR: If you have the votes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, you're not going to go for it, because the ones for whom you're carrying this bill don't want it done that way. Is that true? If they wanted it done that way, you'd be carrying that bill, wouldn't you?

SENATOR STUHR: Not necessarily. I feel this is a very modest,...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR STUHR: ...appropriate cap that has not been looked at for ten years.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did you have any input into the establishment of this cap, or are you taking the word of those who gave you the bill?

SENATOR STUHR: We're using the same cap that previously applied, since 1993.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But somebody gave you that figure. You did not come up with that yourself, did you?

SENATOR STUHR: I wasn't in the Legislature in 1993, so...but that's when it was set.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you're going by what somebody gave you, aren't you?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if they had given you a cap that's 20 percent higher, that would have been as acceptable as this
