probably say, we don't want a fee on hunting and fishing. But that's not the responsible thing to do here. I would remind people that a lot of the deer that are shot in this state, they're doing us a service. I would much rather see a deer shot than hit by a vehicle. And I have killed four deer in my life, two with a rifle and two with pickups and vehicles. And I'd much rather shoot them than I would...actually, I'd apply for a hunting season on deer every year if I liked venison. I'd rather eat beef. Now, I have a brother and a son that, the week of hunting season, don't bother them, because they're deer hunting. But I would remind people that the deer meat is a lot of times donated to those who are in need of it. Poaching is a problem in this state. Our game wardens are spread rather thin across the state. If you want more information on that, Game and Parks can provide it. And if we don't have additional funds, then we cannot regulate this. And I can tell you that poaching has been a problem. You only have to have been a member of the Natural Resources Commission to understand...or, the Committee, to have heard bills on poaching. And we have increased the penalties on poaching within recent years. But it makes no sense to have laws on poaching if you don't have enforcement. And enforcement is a problem. So I would like to have you keep that in mind. Is this an urgent bill? No, we could delay it another year, I suppose. But it's going to catch up with us. And so it seems like a prudent thing to do is to move this along. Certainly I am in favor of it. And with that, I would ask for you to help Senator Stuhr move this bill forward. It is the responsible thing to do. You may have lots of opinions about Game and Parks, some of them positive, some that are negative. But for the most part, we should leave the judgment of what this should...of what the fees should be, to the Game Commission people, and to the people who give the information to our game commissioners. As you know, we did expand the Game Commission last year. I think it better represents the state of Nebraska. It was Senator Beutler's tenacity on this issue that finally resulted in that. It was not what everybody wanted, but it was a compromise. And it's kind of nice and refreshing to see that nobody's talking too much about that. But I applaud Senator Beutler for keeping that issue in front of the Legislature. And we did do a compromise issue on that. It's not one person, one vote. But the
