willing to give me a little time after I speak this time, in order that I can continue this discussion. I am not in total disagreement with what Senator Brown said. If there's to be a user fee, there has got to be, to my way of thinking, a very tight relationship, or a nexus, as they say in the law, between the fee itself and the activity the fee is attaching to. And the secondary issue is the amount of the fee. Is it necessary to automatically give authority to raise a fee when those seeking the increase will acknowledge at that point it is unnecessary to raise the fee at this time but we just want you to give us that option? This is a point in our experience as a Legislature when we should show prudence, we should exercise frugality. And even when we say that the fees we are going to allow to be imposed will be imposed on an activity that people choose to participate in, that is no reason, in my mind, for saying that an unreasonable process should be established so that these fees can be raised willy-nilly. No justification has to be given. There is not one word, Senator Mines, anywhere in these statutes, where you give this sliding scale that the Game and Parks Commission can use for raising fees, which says a justification for the fee increase must be shown. Even under my questioning, those who support this bill have to become very vague and say, well, inflation, uh...and then they find other things to just throw in. But there has not been a solid, well-thought-out rationale which would justify an increase in fees. We are accustomed to dealing fast, loose, and sloppily when it comes to Game and Parks. Game and Parks usually gets what they want. Many people, when they state the name of that outfit, will put an "s" after "Game," "Games" and Parks. Well, they play games, but the word really relates to wild critters that are going to be allowed to be killed while they're out there innocently doing what nature intended them to do. My point here, tailgating on what Senator Brown stated, is that Game and Parks has told us, through the designated spokesperson, Senator Stuhr, that they don't need to raise these fees. They don't need to raise them. Why then at this point, when everybody, no matter how imperfectly and vaguely they understand the issue, is looking at the financial straits confronting all of the states, at a time when Bush and his administration are talking about cutting...
