Committee has provided a great deal of oversight. It was the committee that realized that there were cash funds within the agency that had gotten quite large, and made sure that there was a relationship between the fee and the cash fund and the amount that was available in those. Now, Senator Chambers has also talked about there not being...having been made any case for the legitimacy of these funds. And I have not had a single conversation with Game and Parks about this particular bill. But I have heard on the floor in our discussion many good reasons for the services that are necessary, the chronic wasting disease, the West Nile virus, the drought, a lot of issues around terrorism that may need to be addressed by this agency and may need to appropriately be addressed within the areas that are cash funded through these cash funds. And so I think that we are getting way off the subject about whether this is an appropriate response, whether...first of all, do we have faith that we have a system that is responsible? And I think that we do. I think we have a great deal of evidence that there's oversight of these funds. Do we...is there some justification? I believe that there's been justification. And I think that some of the arguments, very significant arguments that are being made about the financial status of our nation and our state, are best made on another bill. Now, I do hope that the...and am very confident that the Appropriations Committee is going to look at all agencies, whether cash funded...primarily cash funded or not, and make sure that everybody is participating in the sacrifices that we're all going to have to make. But that's a whole different issue than what's before us, and whether there is a connection between the fee and the cash fund, and whether there's oversight. And I am comfortable that we have those things in place. Thank you.
