SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers has asked for a call of the house. Members, the question is, shall the house go under call? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SPEAKER BROMM: The house is under call. Members, please record your presence, and those who are not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber. Senator Dwite Pedersen, Senator Engel, Senator Jones, Senator Brown, Senator Kruse, Senator Quandahl, Senator Connealy, and Senator Bourne. Senators Brown, Quandahl, and Connealy. Senator Brown, Senator Connealy. Proceed, Mr. Clerk, with the roll call vote, regular order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal pages 320-321.) 6 ayes, 38 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to indefinitely postpone.

SPEAKER BROMM: The motion is not accepted. Next item, Mr. Clerk. I'll raise the call.

CLERK: Mr. President, at this time, Senator Chambers...I have nothing further pending to the bill at this time, Mr. President. I have nothing further pending at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to speak on the bill.
