annual bad bills to bring because they don't know any better, or somebody who may represent a shield, because people will draw back and not go after the bill very hard because of the person carrying the bill. I've let Senator Stuhr know that I'm upset with Game and Parks and I'm after this bill, and she cannot be a protective shield between me and that toward which I feel hostility. I'm going to read something from this bill now, because we haven't read much from it. On page 2, starting in line 8, it says: "Resident fees shall be (a) not less than eleven dollars and not more than fifteen dollars for hunting." Subsection (b) of Section 1: "not less than fifteen dollars and not more than twenty dollars for fishing." I'd like to ask Senator Stuhr a question, if she will yield.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Stuhr, is there such a thing as a habitat fee?

SENATOR STUHR: I believe there's a habitat stamp...
