SENATOR STUHR: I guess I'd like to say that most of the other agencies are...and I don't know the percentage, but the other agencies, their funding comes from General Funds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I'm talking about what we're doing here.

SENATOR STUHR: I know, and...but...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Game and Parks came this session because they feel they may take a cut. Do you agree with that?

SENATOR STUHR: They're not...yes, a 10 percent proposed cut, plus a 7.8 percent last year.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And they're asking that we put them in a position to offset that by allowing them to raise the fees from whatever it is the amount is now to whatever the cap is. Isn't that true?

SENATOR STUHR: This bill would propose to authorize that. It still is up to the discretion of the commission. They would have to look and see.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But their intent is to be in a position to offset the cut that they envision occurring to their budget. Isn't that true?

SENATOR STUHR: I cannot...I cannot say.

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. My colleagues, who are a little more savvy and a little less politically naive, are aware that what I'm saying is true. They're being asked, because you all favor them and put them in a favored position, to be able to offset whatever cutting we do by raising the fees. Then they can say the Legislature required this because they cut the budget. If they need a fee increase, let them ask for it. And this is why they didn't ask for a fee increase. They don't need a fee increase right now. But if the Legislature cuts them
