SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, that would be the case.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And all of these sources provide money to Game and Parks.

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schrock, if it were up to you to craft legislation for this session and Game and Parks tells you that they don't need to raise the fees right now, do you think that would be accurate, or would you, in your judgment, think that they probably would have to raise the fees before we come back next session? Let me ask it a different way. Do you think they're going to raise the fees before we come back next session?

SENATOR SCHROCK: No, I do not, and I have an amendment up there, Senator Chambers, that I would think would be in line that would delay implementation one year.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I didn't quite get what you said.

SENATOR SCHROCK: I have an amendment that's been filed that would delay implementation of this bill for one year.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why do that when it's not really getting to the issue? That's a rhetorical question to suggest that the amendment does not meet my concerns. But I'm going to add another part to it. Why do that instead of raising these fees by six percent and letting them take effect at that delayed date? Why would we do that?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Well, maybe it's kind of the process of doing things the way we've always done them. In the past, we've set the caps and we have allowed them to increase fees six percent a year, not to be more than six percent a year, so they don't always increase the fees six percent a year. And they're up against their caps, I believe in almost all situations, although they say they can get along without a fee increase for another year and they have no intentions of implementing these fees.
