SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, your light is next.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. This, this bill, has an interesting role to play. I'd like to ask Senator Schrock a question.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schrock, am I in a position to gather what your approach to other fee bills will be based on your approach to this one?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Are you in a position to do what with it?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Am I in a position to make a determination about how you are going to deal with other fee bills based on the way you are dealing with this one?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Quite frankly, Senator Chambers, if I had my way, we would not be dealing with this issue, whether it be this or park fees. That issue would be left up to the game commissioners. There would be no restrictions on the part of the Legislature. I think they're the ones that are best to determine what should or shouldn't be done with hunting and fishing licenses and park fees. And if they overcharge, people quit going. They understand that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, that's not what I asked you.

SENATOR SCHROCK: My position is going to be I think I'll support most of the fee increase bills in the Legislature this year if they're reasonable.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you would support putting \$2 on the cost of titling a vehicle to raise money to fight against methamphetamines.
