SENATOR SCHROCK: No, I would not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, so you're for methamphetamines. I see. No, I understand, Senator Schrock. I'm trying to make a point, because there are some fees that I would not agree to, period. But the way my colleagues are dealing with this one, where the fee increase is not even needed, it seems to me you would vote for any and every fee. But that would be consistency, which I know is not the hallmark of the Legislature. It's going to be mine, however. I find interesting this sheet that Game and Parks gave Senator Stuhr to hand around showing us the comparative costs of licenses in these different states. A resident hunting license in Iowa, it says...I'd like to ask Senator Stuhr a question, so that I can be sure that I'm reading this correctly, if she would respond.

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute, and Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Stuhr, if you would look at the top line. The first column says "1993 Range," and that's \$8.50 to \$11.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now let's skip "Proposed" and go to "Current." The current amount is \$11, which is the maximum that could have been imposed under the existing state of the law.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When I see Iowa, is that \$17.50 the current amount,...

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...or is that the maximum they're allowed to raise...
