SENATOR STUHR: No, that is the current amount.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did you say time, Mr. Speaker? Oh.

SPEAKER BROMM: No, you have a little bit, 20 seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. In Colorado, the amount is \$15.25, and I have my light on so I will continue if I'm the next one up.

SPEAKER BROMM: You're next, Senator Chambers. You may proceed.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. And, for the record, we're talking about a resident hunting permit in the top line. When we get over to Colorado, which is the last state, their column is the farthest one to the right on this sheet, it says \$15.25. Correct?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that's what they charge right now.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR STUHR: Which is more than what we have proposed in the cap, which would be...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now to the left of that is Missouri. How much do they charge?

SENATOR STUHR: They charge \$9, and that is the least of any of the states listed.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why is North Dakota not on here? Is their amount so low that they would have skewed things too much?

SENATOR STUHR: I don't...I can't tell you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Maybe because it's...
