SENATOR STUHR: It's not a neighboring state.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, it's above. Okay.

SENATOR STUHR: It's not a neighboring state.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The maximum that would be allowed under this bill would be \$15. Is that correct?

SENATOR STUHR: That's correct, which...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Go ahead.

SENATOR STUHR: ...which you'll note is lower. Even by raising it to \$15 then it is lower than what all the states, except Missouri, charge right now.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, when we come down this sheet to resident hunt/fish, some of these states do not have a combination license. Is that why their amounts are not listed?

SENATOR STUHR: That's correct. And, again, ours is much lower.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Have you got figures that will show the amount of revenue generated in these various states by the amounts of these licenses that show up on this sheet?

SENATOR STUHR: I believe I could find that information.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But I meant you don't have it readily at hand. You don't have to look it up if you don't have it.

SENATOR STUHR: I'm sorry, I don't know if I can find it just exactly.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Well, how much is generated by this amount in Nebraska, just looking at the resident hunting license, if you can find it easily?

SENATOR STUHR: (Inaudible) I can't find it.
