retail sales that included hunting gear would be...take place at that store? And if that's not the case, how in the world is one...where's that organization headquartered, if you know?

SENATOR STUHR: Washington, DC.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did they send somebody here to poll these stores to see what percentage of their retail sales relate to hunting gear?

SENATOR STUHR: I imagine, with the technology that we have today, that can be very easily separated in their...when they're looking at their cash sales.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you think that's what they did.

SENATOR STUHR: I would expect that's...I cannot say, but I would expect that's probably what they did.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what's the amount that they say that totals out to?

SENATOR STUHR: For Nebraska, \$232 million.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now...

SENATOR STUHR: That's all hunting activities.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now you believe that the relatively few, small percentage of Nebraska's population that hunts spends over \$230 million a year on hunting gear. The people who hunt, why, if they spend that much money and got that kind of money to spend, let's raise these fees by 50 percent. I will strike that deal with you right this minute if you will accept it. That would be the minimum. Then we don't need to raise the park permit or anything else. Do you believe, Senator Stuhr, that the people who hunt in this state spend over \$230 million a year on hunting-related activities? Do you believe that yourself?

SENATOR STUHR: It seems rather high, but...
