SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...for people to shoot without hitting another hunter. That's a lot of money. Per year? Let's say \$200 million a year, so it's easy for me. Do you realize that since 1997, we'll say 1996, a billion dollars has been spent in Nebraska on hunting-related activities, a billion dollars? Do you all believe that? What were they buying? Neiman Marcus doesn't charge that much. Senator Tyson could get any number of high-priced weapons that he purchases for that kind of money. But I'd venture to say that the average cost of one of these weapons that people go hunting with would not approach the amount that Senator Tyson is willing to pay, because he 's a...

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, members of the Legislature, what we're dealing with here is a bureaucracy that gives figures that don't tell the truth. The first piece of disingenuousness is that they don't need to raise these fees. That's what I would have said. But since I've been assured by Senator Schrock and Senator Stuhr that they don't intend to raise them, I'm going to say they're not disingenuous when they say they're not going to raise these fees right away. Senator Schrock speculated that they wouldn't raise them probably before March of next year, and the reason March was selected as a date, because that was the month included in my question. He didn't give that as the time when they're likely to raise them. But I had asked the question would they raise them before March of next year, and he said he didn't think they would.
