have a piece of paper here that tells us the cost of a fishing license in Nebraska, which figure does not include the habitat stamp, which is five additional dollars. It tells us the cost of a hunting license, which does not...well, the aquatic stamp goes with the fishing. It gives us a cost of a hunting license, which does not include the \$13 habitat stamp cost, which, by the way, is a greater amount than the cost of the hunting license itself. The habitat stamp costs \$2 more than the hunting license itself. Yet, when we're given figures to show us the cost of hunting, we're given the smaller of the two figures--\$11. There's a \$13 amount which does not even appear on the sheet. And I know people cannot focus on this and take the interest in it which I do, because I am the garbageman and this is my job, not anybody else's, and it's known that I will assume this responsibility. But something else I didn't mention. My phone has been ringing off the hook with people who are watching this, calling in, saying that people are not being honest on this floor. They know more about the costs of hunting than I do, and fishing, and activities of the Game and Parks Commission on people's land and other places that I know nothing about. But one of the reasons that it's good that these discussions go out to everybody, because people can see the role I play, as opposed to the role my colleagues play. They can listen to what we're saying on a bill that is going to grant fee-raising authority to a bureaucracy that tells us the fees don't need to be raised. Anybody can understand that. That's foolish, that's irresponsible, and it's highly political. If the Game and Parks Commission was not one devoted to the elitists, we wouldn't be dealing with it in this fashion. You let the agency that deals with the problems of the visually impaired come before us. They're not going to have us saying, well, yeah, let's raise what they get because they need it. They're not elitists. They're some of the neediest. But I'm going to tie all this stuff together and I'm going to talk on and on and on, and not one person should feel offended, because I'm deeply offended by this bill being before us, and I'm going to fight against it in every way that I can under the rules. And I'm going to tie this bill in with other bills that we're going to be considering this session, and you all are not going to be able to sit like knots on logs on those other bills, because you're going to have special interest groups...
