and Parks to charge a fee by rules and regulations. And that is unclear now in the present statutes.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Schrock. The Chair recognizes Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Not on the amendment.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: He waives. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I do remember that story. And I hope I paid off, because I think you won. I think you demonstrated that there were more accidents fishing than hunting, except they're not really fishing accidents. People aren't sitting down in the boat with a pole in their hands when they drown. It's mostly men, and it's mostly because they're standing up in the middle of the boat, not fishing. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, now the battle begins. I fought against this proposal last year. I fought against increasing this park entry fee, ever since I've been in this Legislature, whenever an attempt to raise that fee came up. So regardless of what the amendment is or what the amendment is going to address, I think it's pertinent to discuss what this bill is about. This amendment is designed, as Senator Schrock pointed out, to allow the promulgation of rules and regulations to charge, or implement the fee. So this may be the only yes vote I'll give on this bill, unless it's on an amendment or motion that I offer. And I'm going to harry, hound, harass, and I hope ultimately destroy this bill. At a time when people have fewer and fewer things they can afford to do, individually and with their families, I don't believe we ought to raise the park entry fee. What Senator Schrock, speaking for the Game and Parks Commission, will always say is that we should look at the small amount of money involved in the increase. So I have to give my usual analogy. We have people lined up from here to York, two rows. The people face each other. And an individual,
