will be taken out of their reach, and we will be told that those who cannot afford this additional amount don't deserve to go to these well-maintained parks, the manicured lawns, like you find on an English manor, or a rich person's estate in this country, protected in a gated community to make sure that the masses don't even come close enough to see it. And the state is adopting that attitude with reference to these parks. And that's just how strongly I feel about this. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes. Thank you, Mr. President, members. Senator Schrock, I would...I missed your opening and some of the subsequent debate up here, because I needed to go to my office. But I would like to ask you a question or two, if I might.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Schrock?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I will try to answer the questions.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And just to make sure that everybody in here, including myself, understands, this permit fee is at \$14, and that \$14 is for a year, right?

SENATOR SCHROCK: And it's for a vehicle.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: It covers an entire year.

SENATOR SCHROCK: It's not per person, it's per vehicle.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Per vehicle. So conceivably, it could cover a family of seven for an entire year.

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That is my understanding. And if that same family wanted to go to the park for only a day, that vehicle could go into the park for \$2.50.
