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SENATOR SCHROCK: That's correct.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right now.

SENATOR SCHROCK: That's correct.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: If that family is lucky enough to live near a state park and wants to walk into that state park, what would that family pay?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That would be free.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That would be free. Thank you, Senator Schrock. I rise in support of this bill, because I do believe that it is the best bargain out there for families. Even if you get up to \$20, it is a bargain for a family, of three or six or seven or however many there are in that family. If that same family wanted to go to the movies on any given evening, the two adults in the family would probably pay \$14 just for themselves, plus however many children. That would be one evening's entertainment. These fees cover an entire year for the entire family. And as I said, if they happen to be lucky enough to live near a park, as some in our smaller communities out in the more rural areas are, they can actually walk into that park free. I think it's a wonderful, wonderful facil...they are wonderful facilities that we have. I'm very worried about the parks system. I'm very worried about ETV, and all the other outstanding, outstanding programs and facilities that we have in this state, because over the last few years, we have really...we have struck their budgets very hard. And I think that we, in this bill, are not generating an unreasonable fee. If you look at the chart that I presume everybody has, Senator Schrock, we're thirty-seventh out of thirty-seven. And not only are we thirty-seventh, but by a great number of dollars are we at the end of the line. So I'm fully supportive, and would ask your advancement of the bill. Thank you.
