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project might happen, \$16 in 19...in the year 2004, \$18 the following year, and then probably to \$20. Senator Chambers, I do agree with you that squirrels are probably too cute to shoot. We had one outside of the office window this morning and my staff was trying to get my attention, but I was more interested in watching that squirrel. I don't know what he had in his mouth but it looked like about the size of a cookie, and he was cute. He was running up and down that tree. But...so, you know, you can enjoy wildlife here from your window in the Capitol, and you don't have to have a permit to do that, I guess. I had the privilege the other night of meeting with the commissioners, about a week ago. They had the preliminary meeting as commissioners before their official meeting, and they met out at the Ak-Sar-Ben Aquarium. Now, you don't have to have a park entry fee to go to Ak-Sar-Ben Aquarium, but you do have to pay a dollar to get in and see the fish. For those of you who have not done...been out to the Ak-Sar-Ben Aquarium for awhile, it's worth your time. The world's largest blue catfish is out there. He is over a hundred pounds and when they first got him, I think he's been there five or six years, they first got him, why, he wouldn't come and eat out of their hands. But right now he will eat little trout out of your hand, and they feed him once or twice a week and so, you know, pity the trout, but then you got to keep the catfish alive. But if you want to see a big catfish, he is out there in that tank at the Ak-Sar-Ben. So, you know, the activities of Game and Parks are so varied and it's not only important for parks and recreation, which this money is earmarked for, but for the regulation of our hunting and fishing. And this is not to replace lost General Fund money. They're going to take their hit like everybody else is. They have not had a fee increase in ten years. They've only had one fee increase in twenty years, and the facilities that they've maintained, it costs more for wages, it costs more for vehicles, it costs more for their inputs, and it's time we do this or our park system is going to suffer. It's not going to be...they're not going to be able to maintain it, and so this is a very necessary thing to do. No one likes to raise park fees. We have eight commissioners at the present time and they serve with no pay. They're kind of like our Regents. They serve with no pay. So if you're a park commissioner, you don't get reimbursed. You can get reimbursed for expenses, but it's
