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commission appointed the chairperson of that board and, just by coincidence, the majority of the money handed out by that trust went to Game and Parks. Isn't that a fact?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I don't think the majority of the money went to Game and Parks. I'm sure they got some benefit from it, but I wouldn't say a substantial portion of it went to Game and Parks.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You wouldn't say that a substantial...if I can show you that a substantial portion went to the Game and Parks Commission and it was so substantial that the Legislature saw the need to stop allowing the head of the Game and Parks Commission to appoint the chairperson of the board, would you change what you've just said?

SENATOR SCHROCK: If you...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You don't...what you said is you don't think a substantial amount...they give grants and money out to assist...

SENATOR SCHROCK: Well,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and you say you don't believe a substantial amount of that money went to Game and Parks. Is that what you're saying?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Well, I'm sure some of it went to Game and Parks, but I don't think a majority of it went to Game and Parks. I think it was spread over a lot of areas. I know that the irrigation district got some money for habitat and so some of it was kind of dual project areas, too. But I cannot tell you how much went to Game and Parks and you...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you would agree that a substantial amount of that money went to Game and Parks.

SENATOR SCHROCK: I don't know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.
