SENATOR SCHROCK: You could be right there.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Let me ask you this. If a person is going to buy a hunting license or a fishing license at a store or some place other than going to Game and Parks itself, is there an issuing fee that a person has to pay on top of getting the habitat stamp and the hunting license?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Oh, let me see. There might be. If you buy on line, you may have to pay some kind of a transaction fee. I'm not sure of that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And who would get that fee if you buy it on line?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Probably the vendor.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. But it, nevertheless, adds to the cost of a hunting license...

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yeah, well, Game and Parks gets it on line, I understand.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, the Game and Parks gets it. They get that issuing fee.

SENATOR SCHROCK: If it's on line.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So they've got a lot of ways to get money that we hadn't been told about during our discussion. Isn't that right?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I cannot totally answer that, but I can start getting some information and get back to you on that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR SCHROCK: I will say, though, that if there's awards granted to Game and Parks from the Environmental Trust, they are a specific project. The money is earmarked specifically. It
