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before if I had my way, we would increase the sales tax and there would be no fees for going to our parks. I don't think that's the option today, but the state of Missouri does that and I think it works well. But our tax burden is high enough so this is a users' fee program, and if we want the facilities maintained well, we're going to have to increase the fees. With that, I'll give the rest of my time back to the Chair. Thank you for your time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Chambers, on your amendment, FA1151.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the next breath is not promised to us. Tomorrow is not promised to us. So maybe I will croak before we reach the point where somebody would have to invoke cloture. I would like to ask Senator Wehrbein a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Wehrbein, to a question from Senator Chambers?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein, suppose we took a penny, we took a penny or added a penny to the cigarette tax and dedicated it to parks. How much money would that give us?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: About a million two I would guess.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And how much would this money that they're talking about here...well, they say they're not going to raise these fees so we don't know what the next step up would be.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I didn't hear an estimate on this, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, at least we have yours. Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. I'd like to ask Senator Schrock a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, will you yield?
